THE MODEL FOR REFUGEE EMPLOYMENT TRAINING

RESET: Refugees Equipped to Scale Employability Training is an innovative and radical new delivery model being piloted by Facework to support refugees into work.

It is based on the simple hypothesis that those with lived experience of migration hold a 'key' to opening the doors to opportunity and jobs for their peers. It was therefore wonderful to win the *GLA NO WRONG DOOR* programme and use the prize money to put this theory to the test and pilot the first Train the Trainers programme for refugees, which was completed in May 2025.



In this document we share the success we have had, the lessons learnt and the potential to work with partners to scale this programme further.

WELCOME TO THE 2025 RESET ALUMNI

The first Facework RESET programme brought together 11 refugees from Ukraine, Afghanistan and Pakistan living in London who are all passionate about playing their part in supporting members of their wider community find work.

For our first cohort we took a strong co-design approach and tested a model which would both help participants discover their skills as trainers and facilitators, and also help them create jobs or programmes which would have a ripple effect in helping others get work.

In a short 3 month 'sprint' we have seen some of these projects become established, constituted as legal entities at **Pitch Ready Stage.** Some are at **Planning Stage,** and others are at an **Ideation Stage.**

The graduates (listed below) are now ready to use their 'lived-experience leadership' skills to run either social enterprises, businesses or replicate Facework's employability training model across London. Facework will continue to support these projects as they now focus on helping others and acting as peer navigators and employment champions for sanctuary seekers.



SAIMA JARI MICRO BUSINESS / MARKET STALL TRADERS

After 25 years in Pakistan's garment industry as a marketing director, I successfully claimed asylum in the UK due to religious discrimination and threats.

Now that I am settled and have a right to work I want to utilise my previous experience and with the new skills I have learnt from the RESET project, I aim to develop a MICRO business model tailored to South Asian refugee entrepreneurs. The idea is to rent a market stall in London and teach others the entire micro-business set-up process including feasibility, budgeting, contract laws, operations, managing risk and marketing.



With Facework's support I want to raise seed capital to help participants to start their own businesses in either food, garment making handicrafts or mobile phone repair and I would mentor and provide ongoing support as these businesses become sustainable.



OLENA FARAT POKROVA / UKRAINIAN FAMILIES UNION

Olena has established Pokrova Ukrainian Families Union as a Community Interest Company and prior to joining the RESET course, she has been actively supporting Ukrainian refugees in the UK.

Since graduating from the RESET project she aims to develop 'NewStart' which will empower refugees who are ready to take the next step and start their own small businesses. Many of them are experienced professionals or hold strong qualifications in their own fields. The project will provide tailored guidance, practical support, and networking opportunities to help them navigate the UK business environment, build confidence, and contribute meaningfully to their new communities.



Facework has helped Olena attract funding for her first NEW START training programme from Southwark Council.

WECARE - Inspiring Retreats for Renewal & Wellbeing

As a trained professional psychologist, Stephania has been running mental health support for participants in Facework's Ukraine programme for over a year. Now teaming up with Nataliya and following their RESET training, the pair are developing WECARE which aims to inspire self-care for the refugee community through meaningful rest that nurtures emotional wellbeing and renewal.

Facework will help WECARE pilot this important restorative retreat programme that combines wellbeing practices with the exploration of the UK's rich natural and cultural heritage. Each retreat will be thoughtfully curated helping those recovering from trauma through practical activities such as mindful walks, breathwork and meditation, cultural discoveries and heartfelt conversations, all set against the backdrop of Britain's scenic landscapes and historic sites.



OLENA GUMENIUK INCLUSIVE EMPLOYMENT PROJECT

Olena's project aims to support the employment of skilled refugees and migrants into qualified roles by creating a hub and website platform that connects employers with experienced job seekers from diverse backgrounds. Many of those fleeing war or persecution bring valuable expertise and knowledge from their home countries and are eager to contribute here in the UK.



Olena's marketplace platform will help match motivated candidates with employers who are open to training and hiring talent. The technical build of the platform can be developed and designed by contacts Olena already has within the Ukrainian community.

In the future, the platform may also offer educational programmes to help employees gain additional employability and leadership skills so they can both integrate into the local workforce and also grow their careers.



MOEEN RAHMANI GLOBAL LINGUISTIC SERVICES

Moeen arrived in the UK under the Afghan Relocation Assistance Policy (ARAP) and his journey is one of resilience, adaptation and dedication to building a brighter future.

Having supported UK government efforts for peace and stability in Afghanistan at a senior level, he now wants to develop Global Linguistic Services GLS which will be built on a strong foundation of professionalism, accuracy, and cultural sensitivity. He has already built a website, a functional app, and a network of skilled refugees from various linguistic backgrounds, who speak multiple languages and understand different cultural contexts. His vision is for GLS to provide clear, precise, and respectful communication services.



Moeen says the RESET project greatly improved his confidence and helped build strong professional connections, as well as enrol on the Goldsmiths Open Book programme which helps accredits RESET participants.



ANASTASIIA SPIVAK WORKSHOPS / ANXIETY & PROCRASTINATION

Anastasiia first attended the Facework Ukraine programme back in 2023 and since then has shown almost limitless passion for volunteer activities, 3D digital design and public speaking.

Anastasiia has a deep interest in the roots of procrastination and anxiety and now having secured employment she wants to design and deliver workshops, round table discussions and practical exercises to help unblock some of the deeper rooted impacts that anxiety creates for refugees. By developing a structured programme with group discussions, significant benefits can be gained, helping to alleviate the effects of isolation.




Facework will continue to want to support her as she both pilots this programme and works with other professionals in this field.



INNA ROHOMAN MENTAL HEALTH FITNESS WORKSHOPS

Many Ukrainian women are working in unskilled jobs, struggling to learn English due to exhaustion and emotional strain, and as a result, falling into a cycle of frustration and disempowerment.





Facework will help Inna as she builds her project so she can start to help practically helping other Ukrainian women break negative cycles and regain their confidence, reconnect with their skills, and build a future where they can thrive professionally and personally.



SVITLANA YAKOVLIEVA FACEWORK EMPLOYMENT / DIGITAL MARKETEER

Svitlana is an experienced digital marketer with excellent written and verbal skills. She is also skilled in coding and creating user-friendly websites with superb visual design.

Having joined the RESET programme we asked her to share these skills and run some of the training sessions as digital skills are something that all participants need as they start to market their programmes.

Thanks to the support from Islington Council, Svitlana has the opportunity to work with the Facework team on a short-term apprenticeship helping us with our social media and digital marketing. Additionally, some of her time will be allocated to providing ongoing training and services to some of the RESET graduates supporting them as they develop their marketing and digital skills





KATERYNA OZATSKA YESENSE CIC

Kateryna Ozatska is a successful musician and co-director of Yesense CIC in the UK and founder of a Ukrainian NGO 'Dream 'n' Go'.

Since graduating from the RESET programme she wants to expand her work in delivering employability workshops tailored to migrants, refugees, and newcomers in London. Through interactive facilitation, it will offer a safe, engaging space for participants to develop job-search skills, explore the UK job market, and build the confidence they need to move forward in their careers.



Having personally benefited from the Facework programme, she is committed to helping others access opportunities, build confidence, and take meaningful steps toward employment.

Having had the privilege of working with these amazing participants over the 3 month pilot programme, we have witnessed first hand their dedication and the commitment they have to use their newfound knowledge to support their peers.

With seed corn funding we believe many of the projects are able to develop activities which help other sanctuary seekers grow their skills, find work and contribute to the local economy.







- **SEE IT TO BE IT.** Showcasing how FW had already put the theory into practice in employing those with livedexperience to run refugee employability programmes was critical. Halyna (our staff member from Ukraine) ran many of the training sessions and inspired students.
- **QUALITY ASSURANCE.** Building a partnership with Goldsmiths University as an accreditation partner has proved important in quality assuring the programme and also helping 5 of the participants enrol at the university.
- **ITERATIVE DESIGN.** Testing the initial curriculum (see left) proved positive, but students wanted more training on developing social enterprises as 'vehicles' through which to deliver their employment support to others. We will introduce this element in future programmes.
- **POTENTIAL FOR SCALING THE MODEL.** This programme has enormous potential and FW is looking for core funding grow their capacity building and deliver RESET Employment Training for refugees in their boroughs.
